# Council policy "discriminatory" say Taxi Drivers



The Head of Kirklees Taxi and Hackney Carriage Association has labelled a Kirklees Council safety policy as 'institutionally and blatantly racist.'

Akooji Badat, who is also Chairman of Snowdon Street Masjid said the council's suitability and convictions policy is centered around standards produced by the Department for Transport which describes taxis and private hire vehicles as a "high-risk environment."

The guidance states: "In terms of risks to passengers, this can be seen in abuse and

exploitation of children and vulnerable adults facilitated and, in some cases, perpetrated by the trade and the number of sexual crimes which involve taxi and private hire drivers."

However, Mr Badat insists taxi drivers in the area, the majority of whom are Asian, have been unfairly perceived as potential perpetrators of child sexual exploitation, and compared to grooming gangs in Rotherham and Rochdale..

He told Paigaam: "The are tarnishing us with the same brush as that of the Rotherham and Rochdale grooming gangs because we are taxi drivers. All we are trying to do is make a living."

"If we adhere to the policy, it would mean taxi drivers can have their licences revoked for 6 months, if they accumulate more than six penalty points in a year.

"The policy is not only institutionally racist, it is blatantly racist, why should these rules apply to us?

"We provide a wholesale service; we should be exempt."

However, Kirklees Council says it is not changing its fitness and suitability policy, which was adopted in 2019 and already meets the minimum standards set out by the Department for Transport (DfT).

Kirklees Council says the overriding aim of the licensing services is "the safety of the travelling public".

It says a licence holder must be "a fit and proper person" and that a judgement is made following a detailed examination of their entire character to determine their fitness and suitability.

If applicant cannot satisfy the authority that they are a fit and proper person, then legislation dictates a licence must not be granted.

The guidance states: "In terms of risks to passengers, this can be seen in abuse and exploitation of children and vulnerable adults facilitated and, in some cases, perpetrated by the trade and the number of sexual crimes which involve taxi and private hire drivers."

However, Mr Badat also lambasted the Institute of Licensing (IOL) for providing 'stereotypical' guidance for local authorities to follow, whilst also working within the emergency services are not governed by the same policy.

The Institute of Licensing assist local authorities making decisions about the suitability of applicants and licensees in connection with taxi and private hire driver, vehicle and operator licences.

Their guidance states 'cases such as the exploitation uncovered in Rotherham and subsequently other areas, together with other individual cases have highlighted the importance of vetting and assessing licence holders and potentially catastrophic consequences of inadequate vetting. A level of consistency across the country would do much to ensure safety of passengers including children and vulnerable adults.'

"We feel we are being stereotyped especially when 93 percent of taxi drivers in the area are Muslim. This does not extend to Police officers, ambulance workers or bus drivers, so why are we being targeted? It's perfectly obvious why. What happened in Rochdale and Rotherham has nothing to do with us," said Mr Badat.

Although the Council's policy is currently under review, Mr Badat insists

questioning why bus drivers or people he is unwilling to partake in any form of consultation with the council.

> "They have asked us to partake in a consultation, but we do not intend to partake in any consultation with them, when we are being unfairly targeted."

> On the decision to review the policy, Councillor Will Simpson, Cabinet Member for Culture and Greener Kirklees said: "The current Fitness and Suitability Policy related to the licensing of private hire and hackney carriage drivers has been in place since August 2019.

> "It is normal practice for this policy to be reviewed every three years which was highlighted at a meeting of the Licensing and Safety Committee members in July 2022. A further meeting of this committee in Autumn last year agreed to consult on a revised policy, given its last review date.

> "Results of the consultation will provide insight into public opinion on the proposed changes to the policy as well as giving respondents an opportunity to give their views on whether any further changes are required. We encourage people to take part in the consultation which is live until 15 February via: https://online1. snapsurveys.com/kirklees-policy."

### **Turkey threatens to veto** Sweden's NATO application

Turkey's President, Recep Tayyip Erdogan has threatened to veto Sweden's application to join NATO.

This is due to the actions of Rasmus Paludan, leader a far-right leader, who burnt a copy of the Quran outside the Turkish embassy in Sweden under the protection of local police. Days before Paludan's imbecilic actions, the Turkish government summoned the Swedish

ambassador to demand that the planned demonstration be banned, stating "It would be a hate crime and a provocation."

Erdogan said Sweden's hopes of joining Nato could be more or less over: "Those who allow such blasphemy in front of our embassy can no longer expect our support for their Nato membership," he warned.

Pictures of Paludan were torched by

angry crowds outside Sweden's embassy in Istanbul. Tellingly, located outside the embassy, is a digital sign showcasing the Ukrainian flag as a symbol of opposition to Russia's war.

However, the embassy has now been temporarily closed and the Swedish government is now backing down in relation to their perceived perception of free speech.

# £12 million awarded to Batley to regenerate the town centre

Batley town centre is to undergo a major transformation after a successful bid for a £12 million share of the Government's Levelling Up Fund (LUF) was signed off by Levelling Up Secretary, Michael Gove, who was won over during a visit to the area in December 2022.

The Batley Blueprint will be largely funded by the LUF, with an extra £3 million funding from the council and West Yorkshire Combined Authority's 'Streets for People initiative', totalling approximately £15 million for the project.

The news has been well received by IMWS and members of the community, who say they are 'delighted' that the town has been successful in its bid.

IMWS Chair, Rafik Dabhad congratulated everyone involved, in relation to securing the funding. However, he urged the local MP, Kirklees Council and the LUF to continue to consult with the local community in relation to any proposed design plans from gestation all the way to the implementation stage, thus ensuring any outcome is for the betterment of the area and its residents.

He said: "This is excellent news for the town and all the residents of Batley. Many people have been involved, and still are, with the town's Blueprint.

"Kirklees, the MP Kim Leadbeater, the Fire Service and Police alongside local residents and businesses all those who contributed their thoughts during the consultation process. Everyone involved worked hard and put a very strong submission forward which shows in the near full amount awarded.

"Working in unity together, ensures we have all won this funding. Batley town centre has a vibrant town centre, showcasing a plethora of multicultural businesses.

"I am sure everyone who worked very hard in helping put the bid together and keeping the communities informed and included in the process, will be keen to gauge the views of those who live, work, and own a business in the area, thus ensuring their voices are heard and put in the design plan for an improved Batley town centre."

The leader of Kirklees Council, Cllr Shabir Pandor told Paigaam, the successful bid will bring a wealth of opportunities for the entire community. Mr Pandor pledged to work with local residents and businesses to bring the plans to fruition.

"The bidding process has shown the very best of Batley. Our bid has been a true team effort and I can't wait to start delivering the project. The council's bid means major improvements to Batley town centre, creating a more modern destination, and a safe and inviting environment for everyone who lives, works and visits the area."

It is envisaged, that the transformation could stimulate up to £60M of economic investment into Batley over the next few years.

"We'll continue to work with local businesses and residents as we deliver these major improvements. We submitted four Kirklees bids during this round of bids for Levelling Up funds. We will keep working to bring investment to all parts of Kirklees and we have a great selection of ambitious plans that will help us deliver the economic growth we all need."

The plans include making improvements to Commercial Street with improvements to public areas along with sustainable transport routes, opening up the town centre for improved business and market opportunities.

"A socialising space would be created, with the aim of increasing footfall to local businesses and improve access to Tesco supermarket and to Commercial Street. Improved pedestrian and cycle links to the park and better lighting along local routes are proposed, connecting several of the other proposed projects around Batley."

Paigaam has consistently campaigned for additional investment to be made available in the area. In August 2021, Paigaam called for additional investment for Batley, after it was announced that the local authority intended to invest £50 million to transform Dewsbury town centre, market and surrounding area as part of a major regeneration package under the Dewsbury blueprint project.

However, at the time, people in Batley called on the council to clarify why the local authority intended to allocate just £1.5 million to Batley and neighbouring towns such as Heckmondwike, Cleckheaton and Holmfirth.

### **BBC:** 'Modi directly responsible for 2002 Gujarat massacre'

Modi Question accused Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi of being "directly responsible for the 2002 massacre of Muslims in the state of Gujarat".

Modi was the chief minister of Gujarat when it was gripped by riots that left more than 1,000 people dead – including Batley men - Sakil and Saeed Dawood whilst their cousin Imran Dawood was also stabbed and left for dead. However, he miraculously survived.

The violence erupted after a train carrying Hindu pilgrims caught fire, killing 59. It resulted in the displacement of hundreds of Muslims and the destruction of hundreds of mosques, stated the documentary.

Accused of failing to stop the rioting, Modi denied the accusations and was exonerated in 2012 following an inquiry by India's top court. Another petition questioning his exoneration was dismissed last year. In addition, the BBC report read: "so much damage could not have been inflicted without the climate of impunity created by the state government.

"There was widespread and systematic rape of Muslim women with the intent to

A BBC documentary titled India: The purge Muslims from Hindu areas. The a systematic campaign of violence has all the hallmarks of ethnic cleansing."

> To add insult to injury, British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak defended Modi during Prime Minister's Questions (PMQs) in the House of Commons. The MP for Bradford East, Imran Hussain asked the PM if he agreed with claims in the BBC documentary that some UK Foreign Office diplomats believed that "Modi was directly responsible" for the Gujarat massacre.

> Sunak said that the UK government's position has been "clear and longstanding, and hasn't changed", adding that the UK doesn't tolerate persecution where it appears anywhere.

> However, defending Modi, he added: "I'm not sure I agree at all with the characterisation that the honourable gentleman has put forward," Sunak added.

> In addition, India's foreign ministry dismissed the BBC documentary on Modi which questioned his leadership during the 2002 Gujarat riots as "propaganda".

> Terming the BBC documentary, a "propaganda piece" meant to push

"discredited narrative", ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said a "bias", "lack of objectivity", and "continuing colonial mindset" is "blatantly visible" in it.


The Dawood family say they have had to not only endured the tragedy for over 20 years, their grief is compounded by the lack of any serious or thorough Indian police investigation.

The family have had to visit the crime scene themselves, find vital clues and collate forensic evidence including the charred remains of bodies and no one has been convicted for the murders.

However, the family insist their faith in the Almighty and the act that he is indeed the best of planners, gives them a great deal of solace.

Family spokesman Yusuf Dawood said: "Modi's crimes will never be forgotten no matter how many spin doctors are paid to try and whitewash the blood on his hands.

"The Almighty (swt) is the greatest of planners and we must all do our part to tackle these crimes against humanity and banish the hypocrites."





# IMWS hand out gift packs to A&E patients

he Indian Muslim Welfare Society have been lifting the spirits of patients waiting in the accident and emergency ward at Dewsbury and district Hospital by providing hundreds of refreshment packs.

# New Police suggestion drop box installed at IMWS

embers of the public have been urged to make any anonymous suggestions and provide local intelligence for the Police at the Al-Hikmah Centre.

The Indian Muslim Welfare Society has teamed up with West Yorkshire Police in order to facilitate the installation of a safe and secure Police drop box, located adjacent to the front door entrance.

It is envisaged, locals will be able to anonymously report intelligence across a plethora of activities such as drug related information on dealers, criminals, traffic, vehicles and more.

The roll out of the drop box is part of a concerted effort by the District Commander for Kirklees Police, Chief Superintendent Jim Griffiths, to tackle and reduce ASB and crime in the area.

After consultations with the IMWS Executive team along with the local community and partner organisations, Mr Griffiths believes it will be easier for members of the community to report local information/intelligence.

He said: "The drop box is just one measure needed to reduce ASB, vehicle offences and crime alongside much earlier intervention including support for people in difficult circumstances, and tackling issues centred around a range of issues that blight our community.

"It is a safe way to report any local information and intelligence. These boxes prove most effective when the community wants them and the message, we got from IMWS and partner organisations is that it is needed.

"Crime can ruin the lives of individuals, families and entire communities. If you

have a concern, or know somebody who does, I strongly recommend you use the drop box."

However, the Police have advised the public not to use the drop box to report crimes themselves - these need reporting in the normal manner by contacting the police directly. The box is for local intelligence.

IMWS General Manager, Nadeem Raja welcomed the move and said the Society is keen on working with the police in order to help ensure the borough is regarded as one of the safest within the Muslim community and within the country.

He said: "IMWS has an important role to play in relation to helping the Police in prevent crime. IMWS is committed to showcase how working with the likes of Chief Superintendent Jim Griffiths and his senior leadership team to officers on the beat to ensure the area is safe, and is also seen as a model of tolerant inclusiveness nationwide.

"By working closely with the Police, we aim to showcase how the Muslim Community are law abiding citizens, who are happy to help the Police locate and deal with any criminal activity, whilst also working with the force to emphasise with the community in relation to sensitive issues, whilst also helping them root out any so called bad apples, who tarnish the good work of the force.

"IMWS along with our members and affiliated Masjids are committed to keeping the area safe whilst preventing any harm which is caused by crime to our fellow citizens, regardless of their background. We are committed to working with the police to tackle and prevent crime in our local area and across the borough."

Members of the public have also been urged to report crime via dialling 999 for

emergencies, 101 for non-emergencies, on webchat, by e-mail, in person at a Police Station or to an officer out on patrol.

Mr Raja also elaborated on plans by West Yorkshire Police to hold a recruitment day event at the Al-Hikmah Centre, on the 16th of February, during the school half-term holidays in February: "West Yorkshire Police are going to hold a recruitment event at the Al-Hikmah Centre. Please look out on all our official channels for more information and official announcements."

In a previous interview with Paigaam, Chief Superintendent Jim Griffiths explained how working with IMWS is an opportunity he perceives as one too good to pass up on.

Speaking at the time, he said: "I think what we need to do is work closer with IMWS to make sure that people know what we are doing and we can tell trusted individuals in the community what we are doing so that message can get out more.

"I can really see the opportunities that are in IMWS and how as policing we can work with them. For example, when we are trying to recruit more people from the Asian community, have we ever had a recruitment event at IMWS? We haven't but why not? I would be up for it?"



# Opening pathways to reading

knowledge-based, global economy, knowing how to read well is more important than ever, and yet a large majority of children - in the vicinity are leaving junior and high schools with distressingly weak reading skills.

However, swashbuckling duo, of a Head Teacher and consisting teaching assistant at Field Lane Junior, Infant and Nursery school have researched and developed a ground-breaking system on how reading, coupled with the understanding of language skills, can set a foundation for reading proficiency within young children.

Principal, Hilary Towers-Islam along with Teaching Assistant, Amna Qureshi, conducted research by highlighting the power of dialogic questioning, phonics, reading and engaging conversation between adults and children, thus closing a 'participation gap' and opening pathways to reading for Pakistani children in particular.

Pointing to the benefits of parents engaging in positive interaction with their children, Amna explains the rationale behind the inception of the 'research group' and sheds light on the fascinating and elusive manner in which she has had such a positive effect on parents and children alike.

Amna told Paigaam: "When Hilary mentioned that the Pakistani boys in particular, were not doing well, not just in our school, but nationally, I decided that I was going to do something about it

With an emphasis on joint engagement, Amna gave particular weight to examples of reading in the hope of sparking shared moments of engagement between parents and their children. Within weeks, the 'Research Group' was formed and the rest, as they say, is history: "I thought, I've got parents here who are willing to come in, on a weekly basis, to learn phonics women from the original group. She's now for their children. They are dedicated and do not waste time scrolling through social media channels all day. I realised that if we invest in these parents, they will support their children in key stage one but also the other children that are going to come to us in the future.

"A prime example is one of the parents who had a child in year two, was also supporting her child in nursery, who has now started our reception this year and is fully aware of the phonics and sounds, so that was a huge investment and we've seen the outcome already. We completed level one successfully in July, where we also had a graduation, where we were giving certificates out. In September, we started level two with those parents. It's had a very positive impact in a number of areas."

Amna believes that by taking on the responsibility to assess how the parents were trying to help, not stymie, their children's language and literacy development, the results have been nothing short of sensational: "The selfesteem and confidence of children has increased and a lot of teachers have seen a positive outcome in other lessons, as they saw first-hand how well the children were doing."

Hilary explains that by simply engaging parents and children in activities that encourage the development of language and literacy skills, an impressive amount of work was being put to work in the service of children's literacy: "Our progress measures were off the chart for our lower attainers. That's because our parents were partners with us. Certainly, with the phonics it has had a very positive impact. We also saw many children achieve SATS results that were above expectations."


Hilary proudly explains how parents with very basic literacy skills that would not be useful for children, have themselves excelled gained meaningful employment: "We employed one of the a teaching assistant for us. We've had 5 parents from the research group that have gone on and found themselves a job."

When sustained over time, reading regularly has been found to have a significant impact on literacy skills.

Amna said: "It's extremely important for parents to read with their children. Like we all say, the first educators of the child, are the mothers. We like to say it's the mother's lap. However, It's important that both parents take the time out. We encourage them to make use of anyone that's at home, grandparents and great grandparents, as long as they read, even if it is just for 10 minutes.

Hilary concluded: "It sets the culture of learning together, even reading a book together, being able to share a book confidently with your child, that's the first stepping stone because if they love that experience, then they begin to love reading. Once reading is open to them, that's the world open to you. You've got your non-fiction books to learn about facts and talk about trucks and trains.

"With fiction, you get all the emotional side of things because these characters are acting out this scenario and feeling all these emotions. You don't have to feel them yourself, but you can start to understand how people act and react. So sitting on the lap, sharing a book, even if it has got no words, is so powerful."



# Household support fund

Funded by UK Government, Household Support Fund is being managed by IMWS and is for those most in need of support to help with the significantly rising living costs. The HSF will run until the end of March 2023 or until fully allocated.

Individuals can apply for support of gas/electric voucher top-ups, and other essential items such as a blanket or feminine hygiene pack and household appliances in exceptional cases of genuine emergency.

Who can apply?

- 1. 16 years old or over; and
- 2. live in Batley and surrounding areas
- 3. In receipt of specific means tested benefits or have a household income below the low income threshold (£16,105) and have limited savings

Support will be targeted, although not restricted to the following groups:Single parent families: in receipt of free school meals or benefits, or on a low income or a registered warm space. unemployed.

Widowed/separated: living on own, receiving benefits or on a low income or unemployed.

Pensioners: living alone or with partner receiving pension credit.

Carers: on low income or unemployed, receiving benefits

Those with a serious health condition e.g., cancer or need to use medical equipment at home.

**Families** who experiencing exceptional circumstances: e.g lost job, benefit delays, sudden illness/death/ accident.

## Obituary: Haji Ismail Hafiz Muhammad Daji

aji Ismail Daji passed away in hospital after a brief illness surrounded by his children, grandchildren and extended family members early morning on Saturday 14th January 2023 corresponding to 21st Jumada Al-Ukhra 1444 A.H. He was 83 years old.

Through the grace of the Almighty, the janazah and burial of Haji Ismail took place on the same day later that afternoon and he was laid to rest at the Batley Cemetery. The janazah Salah of Haji Ismail was led by respected Moulana Abdur Rauf Sufi Sahib (DB) - the Imam of Jame Masjid, Henry St, Batley.

The recital of the initial and final verses of Al-Baqarah at the graveside was conducted by his grandson Hafiz Ammar Daji. Thereafter, the concluding duaa at the graveside was conducted by Moulana Abdur Rauf Sufi Sahib (DB).

This gentle and quiet personality permeated in all his dealings with family, friends, neighbours and colleagues. Haji Ismail was a respected member of the community. He served the Indian Muslim Welfare Society as a Vice President and General Secretary and he was a member of executive committee for many years. Distinguished and fiercely loyal, he never missed an IMWS AGM. Hence we was given a lifetime achievement award for over 30 years of service.

He was also an active member of ICWA, and served for a number of years in the executive committee. He was a founding member of the Alipore Muslim Association UK, which he had the honour of serving as an executive member, Chairman and Secretary. He also served in the executive committee of the Kirklees Race Equality Council for many years.

IMWS Chairman, Rafik Dabhad praised Haji Ismail for his commitment to IMWS. He said: "He was one of the kindest

people you could ever meet, caring and working with integrity whilst serving the community. His legacy of hard work, dedication and making a difference will continue to live on."



n 852, a daredevil named Armen Firman decided to fly off a tower in Qurtuba Al-Andalus (Cordoba, Spain).

Firman made a living doing stunts, he was not a scientist but through observing the nature around him and relying on a rudimentary understanding of the mechanics of flight, he built a silk dress with wood-reinforced rods.

With this machine, Firman climbed to the top of a minaret of the grand Qurtuba mosque and jumped. He was unable to fly, he crashed, yet his flying contraption swelled, just enough to slow his fall. Although he was slightly injured, this was probably the first parachute jump in the world.

Ibn Firnas was in the crowd and realised it was a great idea. This truly inspiried him to successfully complete the first human flight, two decades later, in Cordoba.

Abbas Ibn Firnas was born in Izn-Rand Onda Al-Andalus (now Ronda Spain) but lived in Cordoba, one of the major learning centers in the Muslim world. He worked across a plethora of industries and subjects. He was an inventor, engineer, aviator, physician, and Arabic poet.He set up astronomical tables, he built a planetarium and designed a water clock. He developed a process for cutting rock crystal, allowing him to create Andalusian drinking glasses. He experimented with

lenses and their magnifying qualities and anything else that came from glass. Up to then, only the Egyptians were experts in this field.In 875, about 23 years after Armen Firman, the 70-year-old Ibn Firnas built his flying machine after studying the nature of flight among his other studies.

He built a pair of silk and wood wings and sewed real feathers. From the hills of Jabal Al-'Arus, he jumped off a cliff. He would have glided for a considerable amount of time, some witnesses claimed it felt like 10 minutes.

To achieve sufficient lift to support his weight, Abbas bin Firnas built wings with an estimated span of between four and five meters. To keep the flying machine strong and light, he made a lightweight wooden frame, probably using bamboo, hollow like a bird's wing bones.

The parts of the frame were tied together with thin strips of silk, considered the lightest and most resistant material at the time, and which was also used as a fabric covering for the wings.

Finally, he covered the wings and clothes with an eagle feather. Abbas bin Firnas manufactured a harness system that allowed him to hover under the flyingmachine and control the movements of the wings with the help of handles. Towards the end of his descent, he realised he had concentrated his energy on the study of take-off mechanics as opposed

the mechanics of landing. He descended at great speed, unable to control the flying machine, and once he fell to the ground, he was injured.

Ibn Firnas would live for another 12 years after this event. During his final years he would reflect on what went wrong on that fateul day and he reached the conclusion that his design did not include a mechanism to slow his descent. A bird uses its tail and wings in unison to slow its speed and stall just above the ground before touching down. Ibn Firnas realised that he forgot to design a tail!

Abbas Ibn Firnas did not make another attempt at flying in his lifetime. Centuries would pass before another attempt was made by Ahmed Celebi, an Ottoman Turk, in 1630-1632 who would glide across the Bosporus.

In 1783 the Montgolfiers brothers launched a tethered hot air balloon with humans on board in Paris but it was only in 1853 that Sir George Cayley would build the first modern glider based on a basic understanding of aerodynamic theory and glide in Brompton Dale, in Yorkshire, almost 1000 years after the first attempt by Abbas Ibn Firnas in 875.

In 1976, In recognition of the accomplishments of Abbas ibn Firnas, the Working Group for Planetary System Nomenclature (IAU/WGPSN) named a moon crater 'Ibn Firnas' in his honour.

# Lung health checks come to Dewsbury

eople living in the Dewsbury and Mirfield areas of North Kirklees are being targeted as part of a programme which is saving lives through early lung cancer diagnosis.

Those aged 55 - 74 who smoke or have ever smoked are being invited to get their lung health checked for signs of cancer. Detecting the disease early means it can often be treated more successfully.

The initial check takes place over the phone and lasts around 20 minutes. If any issues are found, people will be offered a CT scan at a mobile unit located in the Sainsbury's superstore car park in Dewsbury town centre.

The mobile CT scanner visited Cleckheaton and Batley before arriving at its current location in Dewsbury this month.

So far around 14,000 people have been invited for a lung health check in North Kirklees and more than 3,000 have attended for CT scan. The programme has already resulted in 70 suspected lung cancers being detected.

Dr Khalid Naeem, a local GP and Chair of Kirklees Clinical and Professional Forum, said, 'Lung health checks have a vital role to play in the fight against cancer.

They can help find problems early, often before you notice anything is wrong, and at a stage when treatment could be simpler and more successful.

'Most lung cancers grow slowly enough for them to be found at an early stage by a lung scan – so this programme will ultimately save more lives.'

Programme lead for the NHS in Kirklees, Marion Redford, said, 'Even if you feel fit and well, or gave up smoking years ago, it's important that you attend a lung health check when you're invited.

Lung cancer is the most common cancer in West Yorkshire and is directly related to smoking and tobacco use. There are often no signs or symptoms of lung cancer at an early stage. As a result, sadly around 7 in 10 cancer patients are currently being diagnosed too late to be cured.'

She added, 'We've done everything possible to make the health checks as convenient as possible. The initial appointment is by telephone and people who need a CT scan will be invited to attend the mobile scanner in Dewsbury rather than having to visit a hospital.'

North Kirklees is one of 23 Lung Health Check pilot sites which are contributing towards reaching the NHS Long Term Plan ambitions of catching thousands more cancers at an earlier stage when they are easier to treat.

The programme is supported by the West Yorkshire and Harrogate Cancer Alliance and has been funded by NHS England as part of a national pilot designed to improve early diagnosis and treatment of cancer.

North Kirklees GP federation, CURO Health, are delivering the Targeted Lung Health Check Programme in Kirklees. In total, there are around 19,000 people in North Kirklees who are eligible for a health check.

Nadeem Raja, General Manager of the Al-Hikmah centre, is a smoker who recognises the importance of identifying any lung issues as early as possible.

#### About lung health checks

Not everyone will need a lung scan. This will depend on your results from the initial assessment. Throughout the process you will have plenty of time to chat to the health professionals and ask any questions.

We know that lung cancer is the most common cancer in West Yorkshire. Lung cancer incidence is directly related to smoking and tobacco use is the most important preventable cause of lung cancer in England.

Across North Kirklees and Bradford we are rolling out lung health checks and a mobile CT screening programme to detect lung cancer and any other lung problems as early as possible. There are often no signs or symptoms of lung cancer at an early stage. As a result, sadly around 7 in 10 cancer patients are currently being diagnosed too late to be cured.

# Paigaam Travel: Cordoba

urtuba was the most important city of Al Andalus (756-1010), the capital of the Umayyad Caliphate.

Qurtuba was known as the most cultured, sophisticated and splendid city in Europe and, with Baghdad, the main center of knowledge of the Muslim world. Qurtuba remains alive in the streets, buildings and culture of present-day Cordoba, an essential destination for Muslims around the world.

### The Great Mosque of Cordoba

The Islamic Art is mainly developed in the cities that were once capitals of Al Andalus. In Cordoba we found the most splendid monument of all Western Islamic World, the Great Mosque.

Its construction commenced in 785, when Abd-ar-Rahman established Cordoba as capital of Al Andalus, on the site of an ancient church dedicated to San Vicentee. Afterwards it was extended during successive periods by Abd-ar-Rahman II, Al-Hakam II and Almanzor.

An excellent sample of Omeya architecture, the Great Mosque is a harmonious combination of various different styles: the initial works of Abdar-Rahman I display hispano-visigothic influences, taking advantage of materials and columns gathered from other constructions.

The building occupies 24,000m2 and is divided in two areas: the arcade sahn, where the alminar is constructed by Abd al-Rahman III, and the haram. The interior space produces a strong chromatic effect due the amount of columns and red and white arches. Since 1523 the Great Mosque has also housed a christian cathedral, constructed in the wake of the Reconquest along with other side chapels.

#### Medinat Al-Zahra

Palatal city of Abd-al-Rahman III the most prosperous caliph in the West during only comparable with Baghdad and Byzantium in his times. It was built on stepped terraces to take advantage of the slope of the mountain and each terrace was separated from the others using walls that divided the city into three parts. In the heights were the palaces, in the middle part gardens and a landscape of fruit and vegetable plots, finally in the lower part was the main mosque and the houses. There are still remains of foundations, paintings and columns in Composite and Corinthian style.

### Calahorra Tower

The Tower of La Calahorra rises up at the south of the Roman bridge, the far end from the city centre. It is a fortified gate originally built by the Moors (Almohads) and extensively restored by King Enrique II of Castile in 1369

It currently houses the Museo Vivo de Al-Andaluz. This fascinating museum is particularly educational with audio visual presentations which vividly depict how life was in Cordoba around the 10th Century

AD when three cultures lived side by side Christianity, Muslim and Judaism. There is a scale model of the Masjid as it was before the cathedral was constructed.

#### Flower Street

This small but well-known street is the most photographed street in Cordoba. A typical narrow, cobbled alley between whitewashed houses, its balconies and walls are decked out with flowers in terracotta pots, in characteristically vivid colours, such as brilliant pink, purple and red geraniums.

The alley is located close to the northeast corner of the Mezquita, off calle Victor Bosco, so that when you stand in the tiny square at its northern end, you get a perfectly framed view of the Mezquita's tower framed by flower-covered white walls. You will see this image on many postcards around town.

### Kim Leadbeater MP column

It's a pleasure for me to start my first column of 2023 with some good news. My bid for government funding to help regenerate Batley town centre has been successful.

When I was elected I promised to fight for investment in our local area and that is exactly what I have done.

Last month I brought the Levelling Up Secretary, Michael Gove, to Batley to view the plans and I'm delighted he was won over by the case we made.

The announcement means an extra £12million on top of £3million already promised by Kirklees Council and the West Yorkshire Mayor.

The project includes a major redesign and part-pedestrianisation of Commercial Street and the area around Market Place. It will benefit local businesses, shoppers and residents and make Batley a more attractive place to live, work and shop.

It's wrong that we had to compete against other areas of genuine need for the funding, but this is very good news for Batley and I'd like to thank everybody who has done so much hard work in designing the bid and all those who took part in the consultation process.

Sadly there are still very serious issues facing our community. The NHS crisis continues and it is very distressing that local people are facing such long waits for appointments and unacceptable delays in ambulance response times.

Government ministers blame anybody but themselves for this appalling state of affairs and sit on their hands when they should be negotiating an end to the pay disputes and starting to put right thirteen years of underinvestment and mismanagement.

We need the NHS to be there for us when we fall sick or have an accident, but we should also be thinking about how we keep people from getting ill in the first place. As that will always be better than giving up in most people know by now, I'm passionate about physical, mental and social health and wellbeing.

They are all closely connected and a very practical example of this is the Batley Baths, which have closed temporarily and some people fear may never reopen because of financial pressures.

Venues like this aren't luxuries, they are vital for people's health, both physically and mentally.

Fewer sports and leisure facilities will inevitably mean more people becoming ill. Before Christmas I met with local people to assure them of my support to get the Baths open again, as well as using my position in Parliament to demand that the government includes pools and leisure centres among the businesses that get help with their fuel bills.

It's my job, on behalf of all my constituents, to try to make a difference locally, nationally and internationally.

I've been engaged in important discussions at Westminster on the war in Ukraine, the terrible situation facing women in Iran and Afghanistan, and the tensions in the Middle East.

I am very concerned about the situation in Palestine following the election of the most right-wing Israeli government in history.

I have written to the Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak, asking him to back an International Fund for Israeli-Palestinian Peace. There has never been a greater need for impartial peacebuilding initiatives of the kind the International Fund would support.

No matter how long-standing and difficult problems may seem, I always believe there are positive things that can be done.

So far as I'm concerned, while progress often takes lots of hard work and patience despair.

# Why so many are being killed in Palestine?

srael has continued to step up its near-daily raids across the occupied West Bank, killing scores of Palestinians over the past year.

The spike in killings comes as part of intensified nightly raids by Israeli forces, particularly in the northern occupied cities of Jenin and Nablus, under the banner of crushing limited Palestinian armed resistance.

Civilians confronting the army during raids and uninvolved bystanders have been killed, as well as Palestinian fighters in targeted assassinations and during armed clashes.

More than 170 Palestinians, including at least 30 children, were killed across the occupied West Bank and East Jerusalem

last year. In January 2023 alone, at least 29 Palestinians including five children have been killed.

The UN said that 2022 was the deadliest year for Palestinians since 2006, but 2023 is already on course to surpass that, if the number of deaths stay at the same level, and there is now the potential for a full-scale uprising among Palestinians, particularly in the wake of Israel's new farright government, which came into power at the end of December.

Tensions on the ground have kept escalating since the May 2021 Palestinian popular "outburst" that swept across the occupied Palestinian territories and Israel.

It began with protests against forced displacement of Palestinian families in the occupied East Jerusalem neighbourhood of Sheikh Jarrah and led to a war with the Hamas and Palestinian Islamic Jihad armed groups in the besieged Gaza Strip.

Israel's crackdown included the targeting of fighters affiliated with these groups in the West Bank.



# Takeaway drivers real-terms pay per order drops 13%

delivery drivers bringing takeaways to your door last year were paid less for every order in 2022 than the year before, even as the cost of living soared.

New findings suggest that delivery drivers working with four of the biggest companies saw their pay per order drop by an average of 2.5% last year. This is before inflation was even taken into account.

The figures, collated by Rodeo, show pay dropped between 0.3% and 6.1% for drivers with Deliveroo, Uber Eats, Stuart and Just Eat. A Just Eat spokesperson said: "We provide a highly competitive base rate

to self-employed couriers, which is in line with industry standards, and we also offer regular incentives to help them maximise their earnings.

"We continue to review our pay structure regularly and welcome any feedback from couriers."

Rodeo collated the information from 10 million orders made by gig economy workers, who use the app to keep track of their earnings across several other apps.

Alfie Pearce-Higgins, Rodeo's cofounder, said: "Millions of workers across the economy are seeing their pay eroded by the cost-of-living crisis and inflation, and delivery drivers are being hit the hardest. Gig work offers flexibility and independence, which many workers welcome. But this only works if drivers can make informed, independent decisions."

A Deliveroo spokesperson said: "These numbers are incorrect and misleading, based on unverified data. Average pay for time Deliveroo riders spend on an order has increased over the past year.

An Uber Eats spokesperson said: "We offer a flexible way for thousands of couriers to earn by using the app when and where they choose. We know that the vast majority are satisfied with their experience on the app."

### ચુ.કે.ના ૨૦૨૧ના વસ્તી ગણતરીના ચોંકાવનારા આંકડા

ગયા માસમાં ૨૦૨૧ના બ્રિટનની વસ્તી ગણતરી આંકડાઓનો રિપોર્ટ બહાર પડ્યો હતો. આ અગાઉ ૨૦૧૧માં આ પ્રકારનો રિપોર્ટ બહાર પડ્યો હતો. ૨૦૨૧ના વસ્તી ગણતરી મુજબ મુખ્ય ચિતાર નીચે પ્રમાણે છે.

ઈંગ્લેન્ડ અને વેલ્સની કુલ વસ્તી ૫૯.૬૦ મિલિયન છે. ઈંગ્લેન્ડ અને વેલ્સમાં મુસ્લિમોની વસ્તી ૩.૯ મિલિયન છે (૬.૪ %) જે ૨૦૧૧માં ૨.૭ મિલિયન (૪.૯ %) હતી. ખ્રિશ્ચનોની વસ્તીમાં ૫.૫ મિલિયન (૧૭ %) ઘટાડો થયો છે. જ્યારે ઈસ્લામ ધર્મને અનુસરતા લોકોમાં ૪૪ ટકાનો વધારો જોવા મળે છે.

એવું પહેલી વખત જોવા મળ્યું છે કે, ઈગ્લેન્ડ અને વેલ્સની કુલ વસ્તીના અડધાથી ઓછા લોકો ખ્રિશ્ચન ધર્મને માનનારા છે.

લેસ્ટર, લુટન અને બર્મિંગહામમાં વસ્તીના ૫૦ટકાથી વધુ બ્લેક અને એથનિક માઈનોરિટીના લોકો વસે છે. લેસ્ટર યુ.કે.નું પહેલું શહેર છે જ્યાં વ્હાઈટ લોકો મેજોરિટીમાં નથી. ફક્ત ૪૧ટકા જ **હાઈટ લોકો** છે.

આમ બ્રિટન અને વેલ્સના આંકડા પ્રમાણે ૪૬.૨ % ખ્રિશ્ચન ૩૭.૨ % નો રિલીજીયન ૬.૫% મુસ્લિમ, ૧.૭% હિન્દુ, ૦.૯% શીખ ૦.૫ % બુધ્ધીસ્ટ ૦.૫ % જ્યુ નો સમાવેશ છે.

રરમી નવેમ્બરથી અરબ કન્ટ્રી કતરમાં ફીફા ફૂટબોલ વર્લ્ડ કપનું આયોજન થયું હતું. કતર અરબ દેશોમાં સૌથી નાનો ૩૦લાખની વસ્તી ધરાવતો અમીર દેશ છે. આ દેશમાં ફૂટબોલની કોઈ મહત્વતા નથી છતાં ફીફા વર્લડ કપના આયોજનની બીડમાં કેટલાક વર્ષો પહેલાં તે સફળ થયું હતું. ત્યાં આ રમતની કોઈ સુવિધા કે ફૂટબોલના ગ્રાઉન્ડ પણ નથી. એમ છતાં આ દેશે અઢળક સંપત્તિ લગાવી રેગીસ્તાનમાં આખું ફૂટબોલ શહેર ઊભું કરી દીધું હતું. જેમાં તમામ સહુલત સાથેના અધ્યતન ૮ ફૂટબોલ સ્ટેડીયમ, ફૂટબોલ ટીમો માટે ટ્રેનીંગ ગ્રાઉન્ડ, વિઝીટરો માટે અધ્યતન હોટલો, મેટ્રો સુવિધા અને વાહનવ્યવહાર સહિત બ્રાન્ડ ન્યુ રોડ વગેરે બનાવ્યા હતા. જે માટે અનેક દેશોમાંથી તેણે નિષ્ણાંતોની મદદ લીધી હતી.

અરબના મુસ્લિમ દેશો જ્યારે કોઈ પ્રગતિ કરે છે ત્યારે વેસ્ટર્ન વર્લ્ડ મુસ્લિમ દેશોને ક્રીટીસાઈઝ કરવાનું ચૂકતા નથી. આ વર્લ્ડ કપ શરૂ થયો ત્યારથીજ યુરોપ, અમેરિકા વગેરે દેશોએ અદેખાઈ શરૂ કરી પોતાના નેગેટીવ અભિપ્રાયો આપવું શરૂ કર્યું હતું. આ વર્લ્ડ કપની ઓપનીંગ શરૂઆત કતરે ભવ્યતાથી કરી હતી અને ઈસ્લામ અને તેના સંદેશાઓ સાથે બાંધછોડ કર્યા વિના આ દેશ ઈસ્લામના સિધ્ધાંતને વળગી રહ્યો હતો. બીજા દેશોની પરવાહ કર્યા વિના તેણે સ્ટેડીયમ કે જાહેરમાં આલ્કોહોલ ઉપર પાબંદી, જાહેર માર્ગો અને સ્ટેડીયમમાં બિભિત્સ પહેરવેશ અને અભદ્ર વર્તણુંક ઉપર પણ પાબંદી લગાવી હતી. વળી એલજીબીટીના હક્કો માટે ગેરમુસ્લિમ દેશો જે અવાજ ઉઠાવી રહ્યા છે તેનાં ઉપર પણ કતરે સખત વલણ અપનાવ્યું હતું. જો કે યુરોપના ઘણાં ફૂટબોલના પ્રવકતાઓએ આ વર્લ્ડ કપને બદનામ કરવાના અનેક પ્રયત્નો કર્યા હતા. પરંતુ કતરે જરાપણ નમતું જોખ્યું ન હતું, જેથી વિરોધીઓને સફળતા મળી ન હતી.

ઉદઘાટન સમારંભમાં કુરઆન શરીફની તીલાવત અને ઈસ્લામનો શાંતિનો સંદેશ પાઠવવામાં આવ્યો હતો. અનેક ભાષાઓમાં તેનુ પ્રસારણ થયું હતું. જેની વિશ્વમાં વાહવાહ થઈ હતી. કતરમાં વિઝીટરો, ખેલાડીઓ વગેરેઓનું એટલું ઉત્સાહપૂર્વક વેલકમ થયું હતું કે દુનિયા દંગ રહી ગઈ હતી. લોકોએ સરકારની વ્યવસ્થાના ભારેભાર વખાણ કરતા અનેક વિડીયો શોશ્યલ મિડીયા ઉપર ફરતા કર્યા હતા.અને કોઈપણ અનિચ્છનિય બનાવો બન્યા ન હતા. આમ શાંતિપૂર્વક તમામ આયોજન સફળ રહ્યું હતું.


